

“You show that you are a letter from Christ...”

I inadvertently came across a chapter of scripture in II Corinthians that has been nourishing my soul the past few days. Paul writes to the believers in Corinth, beginning in chapter 3:2, “You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. You show that you are a letter from Christ, the result of our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.” (II Cor. 3:2-3)

This small section of truth communicates so much. We celebrated five men graduating from the program this past Sunday. After the service, we proceeded to the waters of Lake Elijah where they were immersed in the water and raised again to symbolize the ‘New Life’ they now have within them. They have committed to living their lives in a way that brings Jesus Christ glory and honor. By His divine grace, they have decided to follow Him - no turning back.

These men are our letter, written on our hearts and now read by everyone. They are an epistle of love from Christ, composed by the Spirit of the living God. This is hard for some to understand or comprehend; yet, we cannot take away from the testimony that is now inscribed on the hearts of these men. They have collided with the ‘Creator of the universe’ and the ‘Redeemer of their souls’; they have been captivated by Him and are now taking hold of Him and His great purpose in return.

Later on in the same chapter, verse 16 and 17 says, “But whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.” The Spirit of the living God causes this turning towards Himself and the “veil” to be removed; eyes are opened and hearts are softened. The author of our faith imparts His message into the hearts of these men. He leaves His everlasting mark, identifying those who are now His and sending out an announcement to others of His relentless love, power, and grace through each one.
