On October 1st, the men pictured above went through an ordination service here at Dunklin and this verse was used to highlight what God has called them to. This was initially written by Isaiah and then quoted by Jesus in His first recorded sermon. In summary, Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist and then immediately found Himself in a battle with, satan, being tempted in the wilderness for 40 days while He fasted. He eventually returned to Galilee, went to Nazareth, and entered His local synagogue (which was the one He grew up in).

He was handed the scroll as He stood and began to read the 61st chapter of Isaiah. Luke 4:14-21 tells of this exchange that took place. What was the significance of Him reading this? He was identifying Himself as the Messiah that Isaiah prophesied about 700 years prior. Upon finishing, He said, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

To me, this is one of the most powerful events of Jesus' life on earth. This is the moment that His purpose is clarified and who He is becomes fully evident to the people. He was anointed and set apart for the purpose of doing all that is specified in Isaiah 61. He proclaims good news, He heals the brokenhearted, He proclaims freedom for the captives, and releases from darkness those who are imprisoned. This is the entire gospel story in a brief, yet breathtaking and clarifying synopsis.

Jesus then communicates in John 15:16, "You have not chosen Me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that you should go and bring forth fruit – fruit that will last." What a great calling and privilege to be ordained by Him to bring His gospel to the poor, brokenhearted captives living in darkness.

These men have been ordained as "priests of the Lord;" they have been giving away that which was generously given to them. They were brought to the program, redeemed, and received this message of life for themselves first. In the midst of their darkness and captivity, the freedom of Christ was breathed into their souls and now they have been ordained to be "ministers of God for the display of His splendor."

They are a people the Lord has blessed!
