He is offering each man His free gift of life and forgiveness. The men then proceed to stand up one at a time, sharing with the body of Christ what they are grateful for and specifying the amazing things the Lord is doing.

I listen intently because what these men express reveals what’s in the deeper places within their souls. I heard a father today mention that he was grateful for his son visiting and all he really wants to be is a good dad. There is so much to consider in that thought. Most of us can relate to that heartfelt desire. Our heart is to bless our children, to love them extravagantly, and to offer them a ‘covering’ to find refuge. Amidst all the hopes and visions that well up within us as men, the one that comes with a strong burden is to be a good Dad.

As we ourselves are recipients of His reckless love, grace, and mercy, may we all share this love with our children in the same way. The gift of fatherhood – what a tremendous blessing.
